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SCOTT CITY COUNCIL MEETING

October 3rd, 2022

Call to order: A meeting of the Council was held on Monday, October 3rd, 2022, in the Council Chambers located at City Hall, 215 Chester Ave. Mayor Norman Brant called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. The following council members were present: Randy Morse, Cody Page, Jack Howard, Rick Brashear, Mike Rhymer, Kenny Page, Victor Phillips, and Heather Ingvalson

Prayer and Pledge: Prayer was led by Pastor Cletus Glueck. Pledge was led by Mayor Norman Brant

Approval of Agenda: Agenda needs to be amended for closed meeting to include #12 "Sealed bids and related documents, until the bids are opened" and remove #9. Motion to approve the amended October 3rd, 2022, agenda was made by Council Member Mike Rhymer; Seconded by Council Member Heather Ingvalson. All in favor; None opposed; Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes:

Motion to approve the September 19th, 2022, meeting minutes was made by Council Member Kenny Page; Seconded by Council Member Mike Rhymer. All in favor; None opposed. Motion carried.

Motion to approve the September 27th, 2022, meeting minutes was made by Council Member Victor Phillips; Seconded by Council Member Rick Brashear. All in favor; None opposed. Motion carried.

Approval of Bills: Motion to pay bills on October 4th, 2022, in the amount of \$33,868.29 was made by Council Member Heather Ingvalson; Seconded by Council Member Kenny Page. All in favor; None opposed; Motion carried.

Public Forum:

Taylor Lindeman and her husband are building a new home on her parent's property and would like to tie into City water. City ordinance states that any property that touches city limits and ties into City utilities will be annexed. Property may need to be re-plotted. If they are annexed, \$500 hook up fee and fire protection fee would be waived. Taylor will discuss with her husband and parents, and then get ahold of City Administrator Dustin Whitworth. City Administrator will review City ordinance.

Francis Baden, who owns 204 11th Street East, would like to have the alley at 11th and E. Pine abandoned. Owners of adjoining properties would need to be notified of abandonment proposal. City would need to identify any utilities and easements in alley. City Administrator Dustin Whitworth, City Attorney Mary Boner, and City Council are reviewing abandonment procedures.

New Business:

1. **Dispatch-Purchase EMD Cost: \$70,387**

Motion was made by Council Member Randy Morse to purchase the EMD at a cost of \$70,387; Council Member Heather Ingvalson seconded the motion. All in favor; None opposed; Motion carried.

2. **Parks: Appointing new board members**

Parks Director Skylar Cobb recommends Kara Shumaker and Toby Seabaugh to the Park Board. Council Member Kenny Page made a motion to accept the recommendations to the Park Board; Council Member Victor Phillips seconded the motion. All in favor; None opposed; Motion carries.

3. **Darren Pruitt: Closing street and alley at 1004 4th Street East**

City Administrator Dustin Whitworth, City Attorney Mary Boner, and City Council are reviewing abandonment procedures.

Mayor's Report:

- Mayor Norman Brant has noticed that yard sales signs are not being removed by residents. There is a City Ordinance in place that states signs should be removed within 24 hours from end of yard sale. Nuisance Officer is responsible for citing warnings.
- Mayor Norman Brant has been asked if Scott City is interested in becoming a Purple Heart City. Cost would be \$600 to add to Scott City sign, no other costs would be incurred. Council supports. Council Member Randy Morse will contact City of Chaffee, who recently become a Purple Heart City, to see how the City would apply.

City Administrator, Dustin Whitworth: City Administrator and City Clerk Christie Oswald are working on employee health insurance quotes. Current plan with Chap Arnold is from 1990. Dustin Whitworth recommends a plan that will benefit both the City and employees.
